

It must have been about this time that Father, whose farming had been so^o brutally dislocated at Fovant, was able to get the tenancy of what must have been something just over 120 acres of land at Sutton Mandeville, a few miles along the main road to the west. Here he had little or no stock, but grew corn, and may have grazed some young cattle. He retained the tenancy for a few years after the end of the War, but when the Camp land was returned to him at Fovant, he gave up Sutton. He already had the Manor Farm at Chicksgrove which was three miles away, and the difficulty of running three separate farms proved uneconomical.
